### **Call to Order**

#### 1. Prayer

Commissioner Frye led the Court in prayer to begin the meeting.

#### 2. Pledge of Allegiance to the American Flag and the Texas Flag

Motion by Bradshaw, seconded by Cockerham to for Parmer County to enter into a purchase agreement for \$52,000.00 with Shirley Management, LLC with pending approval of the Parmer County Attorney. Motion carried. See attached.

7. Consider the Parmer County Burn Ban.




10. Consider Any and All Matters Concerning the Parmer County Law Enforcement Center
